Our Story

The DRC's mission is to provide a wide range of healthy and value-added services to the communities we serve, through education, prevention programs, dispute resolution support, and volunteer-led collaboration.

We accomplish this by providing resources that are accessible to all populations that we serve, regardless of income. We depend on the generosity of our extensive roster of volunteers and funders to keep most of our programs free or low-cost.

The DRC's roots are in providing mediation services and we continue to do so for the four counties that we serve - Orange, Putnam, Sullivan, and Ulster. Additionally, we have expanded our capacity and now run a CASA program in three of our counties, as well as parent visit coaching/supervised visitation, and parent education programs.

Success Stories

"Educational neglect was one of the issues with the school-aged children from one of our families. CASA found many resources and advocated for services to improve the children's educational opportunities. Permanency was found for the children, with three being adopted in the same home with the oldest sibling joining them with a plan for future adoption. All children continue to thrive in this placement."

"In early 2024, DRC CASA closed a case that had been open for 9 years. The parents did their best to follow all court orders and were able to be reunified with their children after all this time of them being in foster care"






Total Number of Cases - 777
